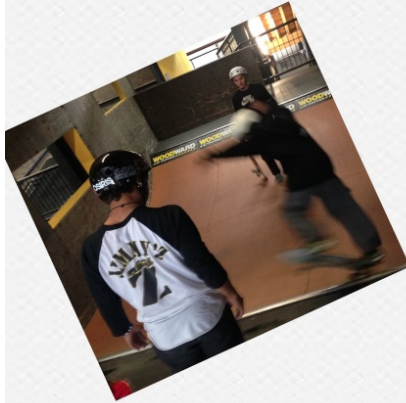


## Pro Clinics

## Progression Sessions

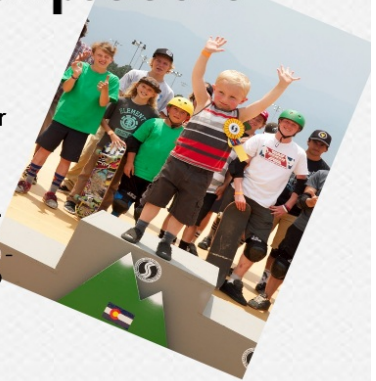
